



Using the CowTime Dairy Energy Monitor

The CowTime Dairy Energy Monitor provides an opportunity to evaluate your own energy performance for your milk harvesting system. The information you gain from this monitor may enable you to reduce the amount of electrical energy used in your milk harvesting system. This is the first step in reducing the power you use in the dairy shed.

Survey work in Australia has shown there is a huge range in the amount of electrical energy used on dairy farms. Some farms use 4 times the amount of electricity used by other farms producing the same amount of milk. The Dairy Energy Monitor compares your energy costs and use with others based in the Gippsland region of Australia.

CowTime aims to challenge you to examine the factors that you can change on your own farm that will give you a milk harvesting system that best suits your farm and family goals. The Dairy Energy Monitor is an integral part of other CowTime activities and technical material.

How to use the CowTime Dairy Energy Monitor

- Step 1: You can receive a personalised CowTime Dairy Energy Monitor report for your farm by completing the simple questions overleaf about your own energy use in your milk harvesting process. You will need to look up your electrical power bills for your dairy for the past 12 months.
- Step 2: Submit your figures: Place your farm information in the appropriate spaces overleaf. Fax the sheet back to CowTime on (03) 5624 2290, OR Input them directly over the web at www.cowtime.com.au
- Step 3: A personalised report will be faxed or mailed back to you OR appear on your screen (print using the icon on your web browser tool bar). Your report will contains your results and some tips that can help you reduce your electrical energy use in the dairy.
